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Contract Overview

- Chief Information Officer – Solutions and Partners 3 Small Business (CIO-SP3 Small Business) is a 10-year, multiple award indefinite-delivery, indefinite-quantity GWAC for IT Services/Solutions in support of the Federal Enterprise Architecture, the Department of Defense Enterprise Architecture and the Federal Health Architecture
- \$20 billion contract ceiling
- Contract Access Fee – 0.55% with \$150,000 ceiling on a task order
- Flexible pricing arrangements including Firm Fixed Price (FFP), Cost Plus Fixed Fee (CPFF), Cost Plus Award Fee (CPAF), Cost Plus Incentive Fee (CPIF), and Time and Materials (T&M)
- Flexibility to use “hybrid” contract types to fit the needs of unique requirements
- Available for CONUS and OCONUS procurements
- No protest on orders under \$10 million, except on the grounds that the order increases the scope, period, or maximum value of the contract. Protests of orders in excess of \$10 million may only be filed with the Government Accountability Office, in accordance with the procedures at FAR Subpart 33.104.

- Free training on GWACs, FAR 16, NITAAC contracts and NITAAC online ordering systems; certification awarded for two (2) continuous learning points (CLPs)
- No special "Delegation of Procurement Authority" is needed from NITAAC to use GWACs
